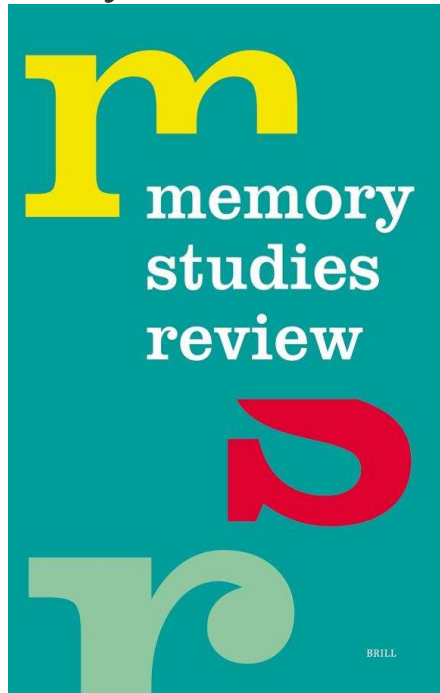


Memory Studies Review
